The 11th of February is Safer Internet day. But as a parent of a primary aged pupil, everyday may seem like safer internet day! Helping your child use the internet well and safely is important. That may mean you have certain websites blocked and strategies in place to support your child if they see something online that they do not like. You might allow your child access to a tablet or a phone and need to manage the apps they use. They may play online games with friends all over the world. It is hard now, to imagine a world which does not rely so heavily on technology. It impacts how we shop, bank, heat our homes and even how we arrange to travel from one place to another (who uses a map these days?). In each of our computing modules, we talk about the importance of using technology safely to keep ourselves and families safe. Speak to your children this weekend about how they can help keep themselves stay safe online and keep an eye on class dojo next week for key information about internet safety.

Being Safe is one of our school rules, which forms part of our relationship policy. The relationship policy is at the heart of what we do at Chester Park. What being safe looks like in each year group is likely to be different as we support the children in preparing for the next stage of their life. Being safe is also a rule that the children can carry through the whole of their lives. In Reception, children will be learning to play and manage disappointment while by the time the children get to Year 6, the children will be learning how to travel to and from school independently and how to be safe while using their mobile phone.

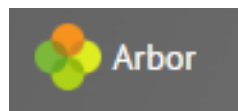

We will also be having a special World Book Day Menu.

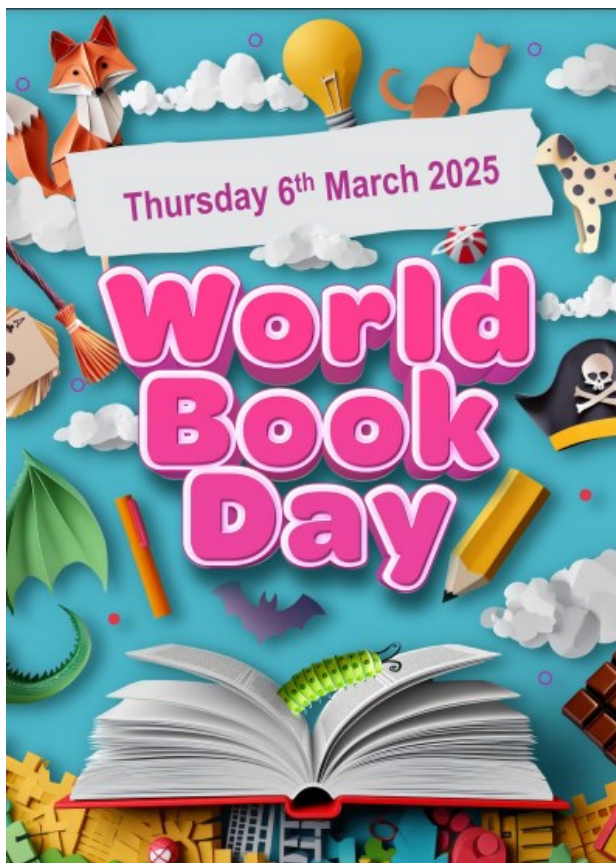
